NCC

- The club, in association with the NSS unit, raised a banana garden in the college premises. Now the club has been maintaining it.

19. Teachers and officers newly recruited:

As ours is a government college, teaching and non-teaching staff are appointed by the Director, Collegiate Education, Kerala based on the advice of appointment given by the Kerala PSC. Whenever vacancies arise, these are promptly reported to the PSC via the Director, Collegiate Education Department. In the beginning of each academic year, transfer of appointment of faculty members and other staff are allowed. Retirement vacancies are most probably filled in by transfer of appointment. Guest lecturers are appointed, strictly as per the guidelines issued by the state government, whenever the appointment of regular faculty is delayed,

Student feedbacks are collected from all departments through Heads of departments and class tutors. The feedback forms are sorted out, classified and evaluated by the IQAC team and a report of the evaluation result is submitted to the principal. The principal through the head of each department intimates each faculty of their student feedback evaluation results with specific suggestions for improvement.

25. Computerization of administration and the process of admissions and examination results, issue of certificates:

- The college has a well-computerised office. Each clerical staff is given a computer. Online communication facility is available with the university and the Director, Collegiate Education, and communications are sent and received online wherever necessary. Besides, salary bills of staff are processed online.
- With the advent of the Choice Based Credit and Semester System

(CBCSS), a major portion of the admission process is being administered by the university. It has established a single window system through which candidates can apply on line. A single application is suffice to express their preference for any number of institutions that offer a particular programme. Based on merit and provisions of reservation of the State Government of Kerala, the University allots the institutions in the order of preference opted by candidates. Actually, the students are admitted in the college by the principal and departments concerned purely based on the allotment of the university. If any of seats remain vacant, the departments concerned prepare separate rank list of applicants and give admission as directed by the Government and the University.

- Examination results are published in the university website and are available for public information.
- Mark lists and certificates are issued by the university on submission of application. They are issued as hard copy.
